Havana so that Cuba will be better able to breed dairy and beef cattle more effectively for the people of Cuba.

In the final development stage is the preservation of the coral reefs and oceans initiative led by Advisory Council member Dr. David Guggenheim, founder of Ocean Doctor and author of "The Remarkable Reefs Of Cuba: Hopeful Stories From The Ocean Doctor".

Hope For Cuba Foundation applauds the recent announcement regarding the reinstatement of a "Full Visa Processing" mandate to be resumed at the US Embassy in Havana in early 2023.

Jorge Ignacio Fernandez, Founder & President states, "For five long years, Cuban families have suffered the interruption of visa processing, that would allow for them and their relatives to experience legal and uninterrupted directions to immigrate to the US. This directive will go a long way in helping to restore the strained relationship between our two countries and implant a new confidence in moving Cuba forward as a true member of the world community.

As in 2021, we have seen advancement with the Embassy re-staffing with our personnel to handle the immense backlog visa applications as well as movement to again provide 20,000 plus immigrant visas a year to Cuban nationals. We are sincerely hoping this new development will continue moving us forward in repairing our relations and eventually lifting the current embargo."

HFC to Introduce Thrombolex to the Cuban Coronary Medical Community in 2023

Founded in 2016, Thrombolex, Inc. is an industry leader in the design, development, manufacture and distribution of innovative endovascular catheters used in procedures such as Thrombolysis. Also known as thrombolytic therapy, thrombolysis, in simple terms, is a state-of-the-art treatment to dissolve dangerous clots in blood vessels and improve blood flow.

In April 2023 HFC President and founder Jorge Ignacio Fernandez traveled to Havana to meet with Dra. Carmen Rosa Martinez Fernandez, Director, Institute of Cardiology and Vascular Surgery, Havana Cuba. Mr. Fernandez and Thrombolex chairman Marvin Woodall will travel to Havana later this year to meet with Cuba's coronary medical community to bring this game changing technology to the Cuban people.

HFC and FMI Implement Cuba Food Initiative



Earlier this year, Hope for Cuba Foundation Founder and President Jorge Ignacio Fernandez introduced Mark Baum, Advisory Council member and CCO of FMI, The



Food Industry Association, to Cuban Ambassador Lianys Torres and her staff at the Cuban embassy in D.C. The Hope for Cuba Foundation project "Food for Cuba" will be made possible with the help of FMI, and its members.

In June Mr. Fernandez took Mr. Baum on his first trip to Cuba as part of the initiative. They had numerous meetings vital to the project, including with the Cuba Chamber of Commerce, ALIMPORT, and independent Cuban entrepreneurs in the food sector. This trip gave Mr. Baum a first-hand appreciation of Cuba's needs relative to food consumption and distribution logistics. The next step will be to establish a Cuba information forum for FMI's members later this year.

HFC Brings Innovative Water Purification Filter Systems to Cuba

HFC has started installing state of the art water filters in Havana this year and will partner and work with leading water purification system manufacturers to donate these systems for the people of Cuba. Continuous exposure to multiple storms and flooding has uncovered an urgent and immediate need for these systems on the island.
